This quilt is made with a variation of a 9-Patch Snowball block ( $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam a llowances are included).

Twelve (12) $61 / 22^{\prime \prime}$ squa res from fabric $A$
Sixteen (16) $61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squa res from fabric $B$
Twenty (20) $61 / 22^{\prime \prime}$ squa res from fabric C
Twenty (20) $6 \frac{112 \prime \prime}{2 \prime \prime}$ squa res from fabric $D$
Twenty (20) $61 / 22^{\prime \prime}$ squa res from fabric G
Twenty-four (24) $6 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares from fabric H
Twelve (12) $61 / 2$ " squa res from fabric I
Two hundred and forty (240) 3" squares from fabric F

## FOR BORDERS CUT

For Inner Border
Two (2) $641 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ by $212^{\prime \prime}$ strips from fabric $E^{*}$
Two (2) $72 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ by $2^{1 ⁄ 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips from fabric $E^{*}$
For Outer Border
Two (2) $721_{1}^{2 \prime \prime}$ by $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips from fabric $H^{*}$
Two (2) $761 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ by $4 ½^{\prime \prime}$ strips from fabric $H^{*}$

## BLOCKCONSTRUCTION

(sew fabric s right sides together)
All 120 blocks are constructed the same way


DIAGRAM 1
Make 2 foreach block

- Mark one diagonal line overthe wrong side of both two (2) fabric F 3" squares (2 squares in total) with contrasting quilting pencil (DIAGRAM 1).


DIAGRAM 2
Place each square over the four comers of $61 / 2$ " square (facing right sides together) and stitch over the line on each comer. Be sure that the colors are in opposite directions.


DIAGRAM 3
Trim "double" fabric comers $1 / 4$ " from the stitc hing line. Open four comersand press.


FINISHED BLOCK
Make, in the same way, 120 blocks from the various $61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squaresyou have cut.

## Q UILT TOP ASSEMBLY

(sew all sea ms right sides together)

- Begin sewing the first snowball. Start piecing four blocks with the same main fabrics, two on top and two on bottom (DIAGRAM 4). (Follow the front cover picture for block placement). Press seamsopen.
- After you finished, start piecing the remaining snowballs in the same way as the first one.
- Piece each row of snowballs.
- After you finish, sew the rows together (right side fabrics facing together). Take much care to match seam intersections between each block (lock them with pins if necessa ry). Continue joining all the rows. Press all seams toward the same direction.
- Press the WHOLE TOP with a hot stea m iron.

## BO RDERS' ASSEMBLY

(sew right sidestogether)
For the inner border

- Sew two $641 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ by $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ fabric Estrips a long the opposite sides (left \& right) of the top with a $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowance. Press open.
- Sew the other two $721 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ by $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ fabric E strips along the top and bottom sides of the top with a $1 / 4$ "seam allowance. Press open.

For the outer border

- Sew two $721 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ by $41 / 2$ " fabric Fstrips a long the opposite sides (left \& right) of the top with a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance. Press open.
- Sew the other two $76 ½$ " by $31 / 2$ " fabric Fstrips along the top and bottom sides of the top with a $1 / 4$ " seam allowa nce. Press open.
- Layer and quilt as desired.


## Q UILT ASSEMBLY <br> (sew right sidestogether)

- Place BACKING FABRIC on a large surface wrong side up. Stretch it with masking tape against that surface.
- Place BATTING on top of backing fabric.
- Place TOP on top of the batting with rightside facing up. Smooth a way wrinkles using your hands.
- Pin all layers together and baste with basting thread, using long stitches. You can also use safety pins to join the layers.
- Machine or hand quilt starting at the center
and working towards the comers. Remember that quilting motives are a matter of personal preference. Have fun choosing yours!
- After you finished, trim excess of any fabric or batting, squa ring the quilt to proceed to bind it.


## BINDING

(sew right sides together)

- Cut enough strips $11 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ wide by the width of the fabric II to make a final strip 322" long. Start sewing the binding strip in the middle of one of the sides of the quilt, placing the strip right side down and leaving an approximated 5 " tail. Sew with $1 / 4$ " seam allowance (using straight stitch), a ligning the strip's raw edge with the quilt top's raw edge.
- Stop stitc hing $1 / 4$ " before the end of the quilt (DIAGRAM B1). Clip the threads. Remove the quilt from under the machine presser foot. Fold the strip in a motion of $45^{\circ}$ and upward, pressing with your fingers (DIAGRAM B2). Hold this fold with your finger, bring the strip down in line with the next edge, making a horizontal fold that aligns with the top edge of the quilt (DIAGRAM B3). Start sewing at $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ of the border, stitching all the layers. Do the same in the four comers of the quilt.
- Stop stitching before you reach the last 5 or 6 inches. Cut the threads and remove the quilt from under the machine presserfoot. Lay the loose ends of the binding flat along the quilt edge, folding the endsback on themselves where they meet. Press them together to form a crease. Using this crease as the stitc hing line, sew the two open ends of the binding with right sides together (you can help yourself marking with a pencil if the crease is difficult to see).
- Trim seam to $1 / 4$ " a nd press open. Complete the sewing. Tum binding to back of the quilt, tum raw edge inside and stitch by hand using blind stitch.
