



CUTTING DIRECTIONS

Please ensure that all fabrics are ironed thoroughly before cutting them. ¹/₄" seam allowances are included. WOF means width of the fabric.

Fabric A

- Cut 2 (two) 4¹/₂" x WOF strips.
- Cut 2 (two) 4¹/₂" x WOF strips, then;
 - Subcut 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 36¹/₂" strip.

1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 30¹/₂" strip.

- Cut 3 (three) 2¹/₂" x WOF strips.
- Cut 2 (two) 21/2" x WOF strip, then;
 - Subcut 1 (one) 2¹/₂" x 38¹/₂" strip.

1 (one) 2¹/₂" x 12¹/₂" strip.

1 (one) 21/2" x 101/2" strip.

1 (one) 2¹/₂" x 8¹/₂" strip.

• Cut 1 (one) 8½" square.

Fabric B

- Cut 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 40¹/₂" strip.
- Cut 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 34¹/₂" strip
- Cut 1 (one) 2¹/₂" x WOF strip, then;
 - Subcut 1 (one) 2½" x 10½" strip.

1 (one) 2¹/₂" x 8¹/₂" strip.

Fabric C

- Cut 2 (two) 4¹/₂" x WOF strips.
- Cut 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 28¹/₂" strip.
- Cut 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 22¹/₂" strip.
- Cut 1 (one) 3¹/2" x WOF strip, then;
- Subcut 1 (one) 3½" x 16½" strip. 1 (one) 3½" x 12½" strip.

Fabric D

- Cut 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 24¹/₂" strip.
- Cut 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 18¹/₂" strip.

Fabric E

- Cut 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 32¹/₂" strip.
- Cut 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 26¹/₂" strip.

Fabric F

- Cut 2 (two) 4¹/₂" x WOF strips.
- Cut 2 (two) 4¹/₂" x WOF strips, then;
 - Subcut 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 24¹/₂" strip.
 - 1 (one) 4¹/2" x 18¹/2" strip.
 - 1 (one) $4^{1/2}$ " x $6^{1/2}$ " rectangle.
- Cut 1 (one) 3¹/2" x WOF strip, then;
 - Subcut 1 (one) 3¹/₂" x 16¹/₂" strip.
 - 1 (one) 3¹/2" x 12¹/2" strip.

Fabric G

- Cut 2 (two) 4¹/2" x WOF strips.
- Cut 1 (one) 4¹/2" x WOF strip, then;
 - Subcut 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 20¹/₂" strip.
 - 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 14¹/₂" strip.

Fabric H

- Cut 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 32¹/₂" strip.
- Cut 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 26¹/₂" strip.

Fabric I

- Cut 2 (two) 4¹/₂" x WOF strips.
- Cut 2 (two) 4¹/₂" x WOF strips, then;
 - Subcut 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 40¹/₂" strip.
 - 1 (one) 4½" x 34½" strip.
 - 1 (one) $4^{1/2}$ " x $6^{1/2}$ " rectangle.

Fabric J

- Cut 4 (four) 4¹/2" x WOF strips.
- Cut 2 (two) 4¹/₂" x WOF strips, then;
 - Subcut 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 20¹/₂" strip.
 - 1 (one) 4¹/2" x 14¹/2" strip.
 - 1 (one) 4¹/2" x 12¹/2" strip.
 - 1 (one) $4^{1/2}$ " x $8^{1/2}$ " rectangle.

Fabric K

- Cut 4 (four) 4¹/₂" x WOF strips.
- Cut 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 36¹/₂" strip.
- Cut 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 30¹/₂" strip.
- Cut 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 28¹/₂" strip.
- Cut 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 22¹/₂" strip.
- Cut 1 (one) 2¹/₂" x WOF strip.
- Cut 1 (one) 2¹/₂" x 38¹/₂" strip.

Fabric L

Cut 8 (eight) 2¹/₂" x WOF strips. (Binding)

CONSTRUCTION

Sew all rights sides together with ¼" seam allowance.

 Sew 1 (one) 2¹/₂" x 8¹/₂" strip from fabric B to the Bottom part of 1 (one) 8¹/₂" square from fabric A. This will be Unit 1.





DIAGRAM 1

• Sew 1 (one) 2¹/₂" x 10¹/₂" strip from fabric A to the left side of Unit 1 to create Unit 2.



• Sew 1 (one) 2¹/₂" x 10¹/₂" strip from fabric **B** to the right side of Unit 2 to create Unit 3.



Sew 1 (one) 3¹/₂" x 12¹/₂" strip from fabric F to the top of Unit 3 and 1 (one) 3¹/₂" x 12¹/₂" strip from fabric C to the bottom of Unit 3 to create Unit 4.



• Sew 1 (one) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $16\frac{1}{2}$ " strip from fabric C to the right side of Unit 4 to create Unit 5.




• Sew 1 (one) 3¹/₂" x 16¹/₂" strip from fabric **F** to the left side of Unit 5 to create Unit 6.



Sew 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 18¹/₂" strip from fabric F to the top of unit 6 and 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 18¹/₂" strip from fabric D to the bottom of Unit 6 to create Unit 7.




Sew 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 24¹/₂" strip from fabric F to the left side of unit 7, and 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 24¹/₂" strip from fabric D to the right side of Unit 7 to create Unit 8.



• Sew 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 26¹/₂" strip from fabric **H** to the top of Unit 8, and 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 26¹/₂" strip from fabric **E** to the bottom of Unit 8 to create Unit 9.




• Sew 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 32¹/₂" strip from fabric **H** to the left side of Unit 9, and 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 32¹/₂" strip from fabric **E** to the rigth side of Unit 9 to create Unit 10.



• Sew 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 34¹/₂" strip from fabric I to the top of Unit 10, and 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 34¹/₂" strip from fabric B to the bottom of Unit 10 to create Unit 11.




• Sew 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 40¹/₂" strip from fabric I to the left side of Unit 11, and 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 40¹/₂" strip from fabric B to the rigth side of Unit 11 to create Unit 12.



• Sew 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 42¹/₂" strip from fabric I to the top of Unit 12, and 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 42¹/₂" strip from fabric F to the bottom of unit 12 to create Unit 13.






- Sew 1 (one) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle from fabric I and 1 (one) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $42\frac{1}{2}$ " strip from fabric I together to make 1 (one) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $48\frac{1}{2}$ " strip from fabric I.
- In the same manner, sew 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 6¹/₂" rectangle from fabric **F** and 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 42¹/₂" strip from fabric **F**.
- Sew Unit 13 in between 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 48¹/₂" strip from fabric I to the left and 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 48¹/₂" strip from fabric **F** to the right to make Unit 14.




- Sew 1 (one) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle from fabric J and 1 (one) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $42\frac{1}{2}$ " strip from fabric J together to make 1 (one) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $50\frac{1}{2}$ " strip from fabric J.
- In the same manner, sew 1 (one) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle from fabric A and 1 (one) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $42\frac{1}{2}$ " strip from fabric A together to form 1 (one) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $50\frac{1}{2}$ " strip from fabric A.
- Sew Unit 14 in between 1 (one) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x 50¹/₂" strip from fabric J on the top and 1 (one) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 50¹/₂" strip from fabric A to the bottom to make Unit 15.




- Sew 1 (one) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $12\frac{1}{2}$ " strip from fabric J and 1 (one) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $42\frac{1}{2}$ " strip from fabric J together to make 1 (one) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $54\frac{1}{2}$ " strip from fabric J.
- In the same manner, sew 1 (one) 2¹/₂" x 12¹/₂" strip from fabric A and 1 (one) 2¹/₂" x 42¹/₂" strip from fabric A together to form 1 (one) 2¹/₂" x 54¹/₂" strip from fabric A.
- Sew Unit 15 in between 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 54¹/₂" strip from fabric J to the left and 1 (one) 2¹/₂" x 54¹/₂" strip from fabric A to the right to make Unit 16.




- Sew 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 14¹/₂" strip from fabric J and 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 42¹/₂" strip from fabric J together to make 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 56¹/₂" strip from fabric J.
- In the same manner, sew 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 14¹/₂" strip from fabric **G** and 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 42¹/₂" strip from fabric **G** together to form 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 56¹/₂" strip from fabric **G**.
- Sew Unit 16 in between 1 (one) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $56\frac{1}{2}$ " strip from fabric J on the top and 1 (one) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $56\frac{1}{2}$ " strip from fabric G to the bottom to make Unit 17.




- Sew 1 (one) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $20\frac{1}{2}$ " strip from fabric J and 1 (one) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $42\frac{1}{2}$ " strip from fabric J together to make 1 (one) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $62\frac{1}{2}$ " strip from fabric J.
- In the same manner, sew 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 20¹/₂" strip from fabric **G** and 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 42¹/₂" strip from fabric **G** together to form 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 62¹/₂" strip from fabric **G**.
- Sew Unit 17 in between 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 62¹/₂" strip from fabric J to the left and 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 62¹/₂" strip from fabric G to the right to make Unit 18.




- Sew 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 22¹/₂" strip from fabric **K** and 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 42¹/₂" strip from fabric **K** together to make 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 64¹/₂" strip from fabric **K**.
- In the same manner, sew 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 22¹/₂" strip from fabric C and 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 42¹/₂" strip from fabric C together to form 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 64¹/₂" strip from fabric C.
- Sew Unit 18 in between 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 64¹/₂" strip from fabric K on the top and 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 64¹/₂" strip from fabric C to the bottom to make Unit 19.




- Sew 1 (one) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $28\frac{1}{2}$ " strip from fabric K and 1 (one) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $42\frac{1}{2}$ " strip from fabric K together to make 1 (one) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $70\frac{1}{2}$ " strip from fabric K.
- In the same manner, sew 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 28¹/₂" strip from fabric C and 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 42¹/₂" strip from fabric C together to form 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 70¹/₂" strip from fabric C.
- Sew Unit 19 in between 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 70¹/₂" strip from fabric K to the left and 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 70¹/₂" strip from fabric C to the right to make Unit 20.




- Sew 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 30¹/₂" strip from fabric **K** and 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 42¹/₂" strip from fabric **K** together to make 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 72¹/₂" strip from fabric **K**.
- In the same manner, sew 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 30¹/₂" strip from fabric A and 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 42¹/₂" strip from fabric A together to form 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 72¹/₂" strip from fabric A.
- Sew Unit 20 in between 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 72¹/₂" strip from fabric K on the top and 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 72¹/₂" strip from fabric C to the bottom to make Unit 21.



- Sew 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 36¹/₂" strip from fabric K and 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 42¹/₂" strip from fabric K together to make 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 78¹/₂" strip from fabric K.
- In the same manner, sew 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 36¹/₂" strip from fabric A and 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 42¹/₂" strip from fabric A together to form 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 78¹/₂" strip from fabric A.
- Sew Unit 21 in between 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 78¹/₂" strip from fabric **K** to the left and 1 (one) 4¹/₂" x 78¹/₂" strip from fabric **A** to the right to make Unit 22.



- Sew 1 (one) 2¹/₂" x 38¹/₂" strip from fabric **K** and 1 (one) 2¹/₂" x 42¹/₂" strip from fabric **K** together to make 1 (one) 2¹/₂" x 80¹/₂" strip from fabric **K**.
- In the same manner, sew 1 (one) 2¹/₂" x 38¹/₂" strip from fabric A and 1 (one) 2¹/₂" x 42¹/₂" strip from fabric A together to form 1 (one) 2¹/₂" x 80¹/₂" strip from fabric A.
- Sew Unit 22 in between 1 (one) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $80\frac{1}{2}$ " strip from fabric K on the top and 1 (one) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $80\frac{1}{2}$ " strip from fabric A to the bottom to make Unit 23.






QUILT TOP



QUILT ASSEMBLY

Sew rights sides together.


- Place BACKING FABRIC on a large surface wrong side up. Stretch it with masking tape against that surface.
- Place BATTING on top of backing fabric.
- Place TOP on top of the batting with right side facing up. Smooth away wrinkles using your hands.
- Pin all layers together and baste with basting thread, using long stitches. You can also use safety pins to join the layers.
- Machine or hand quilt starting at the center and working towards the corners. Remember that quilting motifs are a matter of personal preference. Have fun choosing yours!
- After you finished, trim excess of any fabric or batting, squaring the quilt to proceed to bind it.

BINDING

Sew rights sides together.

- Cut enough strips 2½" wide by the width of the fabric L to make a final strip 336" long. Start sewing the binding strip in the middle of one of the sides of the quilt, placing the strip right side down and leaving an approximated 5" tail. Sew with ¼" seam allowance (using straight stitch), aligning the strip's raw edge with the quilt top's raw edge.
- Stop stitching ¼" before the edge of the quilt (DIAGRAM B 1). Clip the threads. Remove the quilt from under the machine presser foot.
 Fold the strip in a motion of 45° and upward, pressing with your fingers (DIAGRAM B2).
 Hold this fold with your finger, bring the strip down in line with the next edge, making a horizontal fold that aligns with the top edge of the quilt (DIAGRAM B3). Start sewing at ¼" of the border, stitching all the layers. Do the same in the four corners of the quilt.

- Stop stitching before you reach the last 5 or 6 inches. Cut the threads and remove the quilt from under the machine presser foot. Lay the loose ends of the binding flat along the quilt edge, folding the ends back on themselves where they meet. Press them together to form a crease. Using this crease as the stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding with right sides together (you can help yourself marking with a pencil if the crease is difficult to see).
- Trim seam to ¼" and press open. Complete the sewing. Turn binding to back of the quilt, turn raw edge inside and stitch by hand using blind stitch.
